

REEESNe is now accepting proposals from groups comprising students and/or faculty and staff of multiple [member institutions](#) for working group projects supporting intermural learning and professionalization in the 2024 calendar year. To apply, please submit an email to ian.macmillen@yale.edu with the subject “Spring 2024 Student Working Group” and attach a single document with separate paragraphs addressing each of the following (note that these are the basic requirements for proposals **submitted by December 31st** – see below for additional requirements for questions 2 and 4 of proposals submitted after this initial deadline):

1. What will be the focus of the working group, and why is this focus important?
2. What are the goals of the working group for Spring 2024 and Fall 2024, and how will you set about accomplishing them in fortnightly online meetings during each half of the calendar year?
3. At what member institution and in what part of the year do you envision gathering in person, and upon what resources are you hoping to draw while there? (We may follow up with you about this to make sure that a plan is in place before awarding working group funding).
4. Who is involved so far, and how will you go about recruiting a total of at least 8 students by February 2024? (Please list the names, student/faculty/staff status, and institutional affiliations of all already-committed members representing 3 or more member institutions, and feel free to reach out if it would be helpful before you apply to talk through your plans and REEESNe’s potential to contribute to further recruitment.)

For proposals **submitted between January 1st and 31st, 2024**: Please make sure that in your response to question 4 you provide a list of at least 8 committed students.

For proposals **submitted between February 1st and 14th, 2024**: Please make sure that in your response to question 4 you provide a list of at least 8 committed students; and please add to your response to question 2 a full syllabus for 10-12 online meetings in 2024.
